# SPIRITUALITY AND SPIRITUAL DIRECTION dtw

The mutual indwelling of divine Love with our humanity, the triune love of the Creator, Redeemer and Spirit of Grace, is God's gift to those who would receive it and embrace it - and what a beautiful thing it is. Saint Ireneaus, in the second century, wrote, 'The Glory of God is a human being fully alive'.

Some years back, at a Clergy Conference, Bishop Stephen Pickard invited us to ask a quite arresting personal and spiritual question of ourselves: "Is the life I'm living the life that wants to live in me?" As you read this, I suggest that you ponder it yourself for a moment.

Spirituality has to do with the whole of life, living and moving and being in God. Baron Friedrich von Hugel called it 'the deepest experience of the deepest fact'; John Macquarrie saw it as a 'process of becoming a human being in the fullest sense'; Geoffrey Wainwright, a 'combination of praying and living'; Alan Jones, 'the art of making connections', Gabrielle Bossis, of 'going deeper, ever deeper into Love'. We are called to a life lived out as deeply and as fully as possible, searching for meaning, living creatively with our unanswered questions, and reflecting on the totality of the human experience. In biblical and Christian terms, ours is to be a graced response to the gift and initiative of God. Spirituality involves the exploration and articulation of what Jesus meant by "abundant life". (John 10. 10) To be fully alive is in the first place to be fully present with God, with others, and to be self-aware. "Who am I?" can be a frightening question for some people. "Here am I" can be an expression of humble but confident offering and surrender to a higher purpose and glory.

Deceptively simple, this process becomes a life's work. It involves both celebration and struggle. It celebrates our own giftedness, and each other's, while taking delight in the whole of God's creation. It includes the giving and accepting of values and principles in life. It does not fail to find significance in any genuine human pursuit. The world of politics, business, relationships and sexuality, and the pursuit of freedom and justice are not alien to this spiritual life. It necessarily involves the struggle to recognise and combat those forces which try to reduce or deny the intrinsic value and worth of the creation and all that would rob us of the abundant life promised by Jesus.

'Spiritual Direction' has other names, and no single name really defines it, for the true spiritual director is the Holy Spirit. 'Companionship', 'friendship', 'guidance', 'soul-friend' are other terms you will hear. They all acknowledge that we are persons-in-community. The Spiritual Director is a person making his or her journey in Christ and whose discernment and support helps, encourages, challenges, cautions, teaches and points another person in their journey. A Spiritual Director is not there to 'fix you'. The person we choose to be our guide helps us notice inner issues and concerns; enables us to discover what is going on in our lives with God; to discern the hand or movement of God. Some basic questions that usually hover over the time spent together are: "What is God saying?" "Where is God in all this? "What is God calling me to now?" It is an intentional activity, chosen and covenanted, between two people. Its focus is not problem solving or even vocational: it is concerned with a person's life and growth in relationship with God that they indeed may fully 'live the life that wants to live in them'. It is done within the context of hope and its goal is the intimacy, the indwelling unity and freedom that belongs to those who have made their home with God.

The Spiritual Director and the person coming for direction (directee) will first talk about expectations and hopes, clarifying the relationship, and if both parties are happy to continue seeing each other, they then covenant their relationship, agreeing to meet, usually once a month. Spiritual Direction is strictly confidential. Both David and Deborah are accredited spiritual directors and are members of the Ecumenical Spiritual Directors Association of South Australia.
